Week 1	To understand where and when the Great Fire of London started The Great Fire took place in London The Great Fire of London happened in 1666 London was very different in the 17th century. Buildings made of wood, packed very close together and covered in a material called pitch King Charles the II was King at the time	To know that the United Kingdom has been ruled by kings and queens for many years His Royal Highness King Charles III is our King Kings and queens sometimes wear special items such as a crown, and hold special things such as an orb and sceptre	To know that history is the story of the past The past is all the things that have already happened History tells us stories from the past People who study the past are called Historians
Week 2	To understand the events of the Great Fire of London The Great Fire started in a bakery on Pudding Lane 80% of London was destroyed by the fire The fire ended when the wind dropped, and it stopped spreading	To know that a coronation is when the crown is placed on the monarch's head HRH King Charles III will be crowned on 6.5.23 His mother, HRH Queen Elizabeth II was crowned on 2.6.53 A coronation is a religious ceremony that has not changed in 1000 years	To know that family trees tell us who lived in the past A family tree shows us how people are related Family trees can show us who got married and who had children The Royal Family Tree shows us who was the King or Queen in the past
Week 3	To find out why the fire spread so quickly and stayed alight for so long The fire spread very quickly because the buildings were made of wood and straw The fire went on for so long because the buildings were very dry, packed closely together and there was no fire brigade	To know about the life of HRH King Charles III King Charles III was born in 1948 and i3 74 years old King Charles III has 2 children and one of them will be the next king King Charles III does a lot of work for charity and the environment	Historians study books, pictures and many other sources to find out about the past Sources tell us about the past Books, photos and letters are sources that can tell us about the past Mary Seacole was a black woman who lived a long time ago and we can find out about her through sources
Week 4	To find out about Samuel Pepys and his diary We know about the Great Fire of London from Diaries and paintings Samuel Pepys was an eyewitness and kept a diary which helps us to know what happened Children describe which sources they think are most useful	To know that HRH Queen Elizabeth II was our last monarch Queen Elizabeth II was the mother of King Charles III The Queen had 4 children and King Charles is the eldest She was the queen for 70 years which made her the longest serving UK monarch in history	Archaeologists find out about the past through looking at things found in the ground A long time ago, people did not write books about their lives Archaeologists are people who find things that belonged to people from long ago and learn about them Often, archaeologists have to dig in the ground to find things that belonged to people from long ago
Week 5	To know what happened after the Great Fire of London to make it a safer place Many houses were demolished Many people were left homeless It took 30 years to rebuild the city with houses more spaced out and made from brick or stone St Pauls Cathedral was rebuilt and a monument was built to remember what had happened	To know some of the major UK and world events that happened during the lifetime of Queen Elizabeth II The Queen lived for nearly 100 years The Queen witnessed huge changes in the UK and the world The Queen experienced many 'firsts'	To understand what life was like in the past where we live To understand that people lived in Bingley a long time ago To know that people travelled around differently a long time ago To know that in Bingley, a long time ago, people travelled by walking, or by horse and carriage
