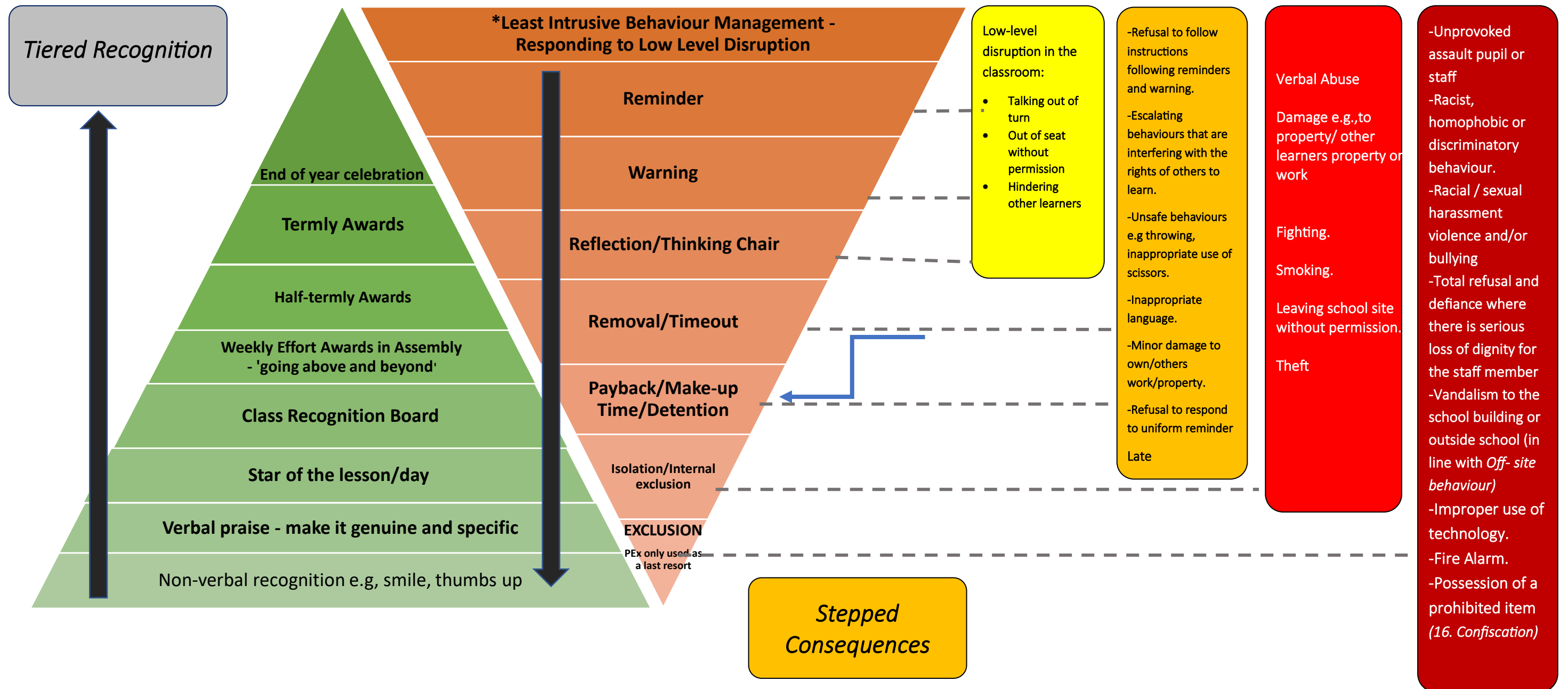


Trust Behaviour Policy: Appendix 1



* **Least intrusive behaviour management-** (Bill Rogers) This approach emphasises techniques to correct behaviour without disrupting the lesson flow. Least intrusive strategies are used to remind, direct and question learners. These may include 'a look', pause, proximity, non-verbal, non-confrontation messages, directed choices diversion and having a private word with learners.

These should be part of every member of staff's toolkit and used before implementing a warning or consequence.
