Week 1	<p><b>To know that an aerial view means to look at something from above</b></p> <p>The word aerial means from above</p> <p>When we look at something from above we call this an 'aerial view'</p> <p>Sometimes objects look different from an aerial view</p>	<p><b>To be able to locate London on a map and describe its location</b></p> <p>London is the capital city of England and the UK</p> <p>That London is in Europe</p> <p>Identify where London is on a world map</p>	<p><b>To understand that the United Kingdom is a union of four countries</b></p> <p>The word 'union' means joined together</p> <p>The United Kingdom is a union of four countries.</p> <p>The four countries in the United Kingdom are: England, Northern Ireland, Scotland</p>
Week 2	<p><b>To understand that maps tell us the location of different places</b></p> <p>Maps give us information about places</p> <p>Location means where something is</p> <p>Maps use symbols to show where certain things are</p>	<p><b>To be able to identify and describe landmarks of London</b></p> <p>Children can identify some different London landmarks</p> <p>Children can describe some London landmarks</p> <p>Children can find landmarks within an aerial photo of London</p>	<p><b>To know Scotland is one of the countries in the United Kingdom</b></p> <p>Scotland is a country in the United Kingdom</p> <p>Scotland is located to the north of England</p> <p>The Scottish flag is called the St Andrew's flag and is blue with a white cross</p>
Week 3	<p><b>To describe location</b></p> <p>Location means the place where something is</p> <p>We can use words to describe location</p> <p>We can use words to compare the location of two different places</p>	<p><b>To be able to use compass points and directional language to navigate between London landmarks</b></p> <p>Use a map to identify and locate various landmarks</p> <p>Use compass points and positional language to navigate between points on a map</p> <p>Use a key to identify landmarks on a map</p>	<p><b>To know Wales is one of the countries in the United Kingdom</b></p> <p>Wales is one of the countries in the United Kingdom</p> <p>There is a red dragon on the Welsh flag. Cardiff is the capital of Wales</p>
Week 4	<p><b>Compass points can be used to show direction</b></p> <p>We can give directions such as forwards, backwards, left or right</p> <p>Compasses can be used to find direction and navigate</p> <p>A compass has four points; north, south, east and west</p>	<p><b>To be able to identify and describe a variety of geographical features in London</b></p> <p>Children identify a variety of geographical features</p> <p>Children use their knowledge of the features of London to identify if a photo is of London or not</p> <p>Children use and understand appropriate vocabulary to describe the geographical features of London</p>	<p><b>To recognise Northern Ireland as one of the countries in the United Kingdom</b></p> <p>Northern Ireland is one of the countries in the United Kingdom</p> <p>The capital city of Northern Ireland is Belfast</p> <p>The Republic of Ireland is not part of the United Kingdom.</p>
Week 5	<p><b>To understand what makes a good map</b></p> <p>Maps often have a title, labels and symbols</p> <p>Maps often have a key which explains any symbols</p> <p>Maps often have a compass showing north, south, east and west</p>	<p><b>To be able to plan a trip to London</b></p> <p>Decide what the appropriate mode of transport would be</p> <p>Plan visits to key landmarks and features in London</p> <p>Use knowledge of the seasons to plan clothing and activities suitable for the season</p>	<p><b>To recognise England as the country in which we live</b></p> <p>England is a country in the United Kingdom</p> <p>The cross of St George is a white flag with a red cross in a + shape</p> <p>The capital city of England is London</p>
