| archaeologist   | scientists who study the <b>history of humans</b> by looking at what has been left behind, e.g. objects buried underground or graves |

| artefacts       | an <b>object</b> that can tell us about the past   |
| prehistory      | the time before written records  |
| hunter-gatherer | people who live by hunting and collecting wild food  |
| nomad           | people who travel from place to place in search of food  |
| druid           | an ancient Celtic priest   |
| wattle and daub | abuilding method to build houses using sticks and mud or clay  |
| long barrow     | a Neolithic <b>burial site</b>   |
| quern stone     | a tool for <b>grinding grain</b>   |
| hill fort       | small towns built on top of hills, with walls and ditches  |
| henge           | a circular monument, usually containing a circle of stones or wooden posts   |
